1. Approval of Meeting Minutes

IPPC **approved** the minutes from the September 22, 2017 meeting, with the following edit: Under agenda item #6, change the last sentence in the first paragraph to read, "Only three top 50 schools are lower than Skidmore for alumni giving on this *U.S. News and World Report* "Best National Liberal Arts Colleges" list.

2. TED Talk: Susan Cain, "The Power of Introverts"

Grace Burton and Greg Gerbi provided comment on why they selected this talk from Susan Cain on introversion. Members of the committee joined in the discussion, and collectively the group noted that this talk provided a great reminder that not all students (colleagues, etc.

4. Center for Integrated Sciences (CIS) Open Forum Debrief

President Glotzbach reported that the CIS Open Forum discussion had respectable participation for the time of day, with approximately 100 in attendance. He noted that, in general, response to the plan ranges from "doesn't really affect me directly" to "this is really important to me"; however, there does not seem to be any substantial opposition – just varying levels of support. Members of the IPPC pointed out that the budget numbers presented in the open forum were difficult to read. It was suggested that the budget slides could be added as an Appendix to these IPPC meeting minutes [please see the Appendix].

5. In It 2 Overview

Joshua presented the "In It 2" website and planned activities. He expressed appreciation to the Inclusion Liaisons (representatives from each of the College's divisions) who helped develop the programming. He went over the schedule, which includes two events with Skylar Kergil '13, author of the recently published memoir Before I Had the Word: On Being a Transgender Young Adult (Skyhorse Publishing, 2017); a facilitated discussion and honorary degree conferral to Dr. Beverly Daniel Tatum, author of Why are All the Black Kids Sitting Together in the Cafeteria? And Other Conversations About Race; a lunch discussion with "Three Generations of Villarosa," featuring current Skidmore student, Kali Villarosa '19 and her journalist mother and entrepreneur grandmother; and a film-screening and discussion of the film Sauti.


6. Call for Agenda Items
